

## "75:1 - 75 YEARS, ONE SEAT"

For the first time ever, 30 original Formula 1 single-seaters together: an epic journey through the history of the world's greatest motorsport competition

Bologna, October 2025 – Never before has such a complete, authentic, and emotionally powerful collection been seen in one place: 30 original Formula 1 single-seaters, gathered together for a single, extraordinary exhibition. This is the essence of "75:1 – 75 Years, One Seat", a special showcase celebrating 75 years of Formula 1 through its most iconic protagonists: the cars.

An unmissable opportunity to travel through seven decades of technology, innovation, and legend—from the romantic roar of the 1950s to the hyper-technological era of the new millennium—told through the very machines that made history.

■ 12 legendary single-seaters are featured in a central exhibition at the *Centro Servizi*, laid out in a chronological journey highlighting the key stages of F1's evolution. ■ 18 additional single-seaters are displayed at exhibitor stands across the fairgrounds, forming a "widespread exhibition" that brings Formula 1 into direct contact with the public.

## Some standout cars include:

- Ferrari 500 F2 (1952) The car in which Alberto Ascari won two World Championships. A personal gift from Enzo Ferrari.
- Mercedes-Benz W196R (1954) Driven by Juan Manuel Fangio in his dominant '54 and '55 seasons.
- Ferrari 156 F1 (1963) Featuring a rear-mounted 190 HP V6 engine, this car marked a paradigm shift in design.
- Lotus 24 P1 (1963) Designed by Colin Chapman and driven by Jim Clark.
- Cooper T81 Maserati (1966) Powered by a V12 derived from Fangio's 250F.
- **Shadow DN3 (1974)** Driven by **Tom Pryce**, also seen in the ShellSport series in 1976.
- Ferrari 312 T4 (1979) Driven by Gilles Villeneuve, famed for the epic duel with René Arnoux at Dijon.



- Arrows A3 (1980–81) One of the first F1 cars with a flat bottom, with a rich racing history across Europe.
- Fondmetal F1 (1991) Fully designed and built in Italy.
- Toro Rosso STR12 (2017) Driven by Carlos Sainz and Daniil Kvyat, a symbol of contemporary F1.

And making a spectacular return: **the F2007** driven by **Kimi Räikkönen**—among the most anticipated cars at the show. This is the car in which Räikkönen won the final race of the 2007 season in Brazil, securing the **World Championship title**. It is also the **first Ferrari of the post-Schumacher era**, and the **last to bring the Drivers' title back to Maranello**.

**75** years in one place. One seat. One legend. That's why "75:1 – 75 Years, One Seat" is more than just an exhibition: it's an epic story of challenges, engineering, intuition, and courage. Each single-seater represents an era, a design philosophy, a driver, a battle for glory.

This cultural project has been made possible through collaborations with: MAUTO – National Automobile Museum, the Nationales Automuseum – Loh Collection, ACI Storico, ASI, private collectors, and historic archives. A unique journey where a single seat tells 75 years of history, speed, and passion.

Auto e Moto d'Epoca 2025 thus confirms itself not only as the largest historic motoring market in Europe, but also as a place where memory races ahead, and automotive culture becomes a living, emotional experience. An unmissable event that unites past and future in a single, legendary fast lane: the lane of Formula 1.
